
Holy Rosary – Our Main Activity







Share A Meal – Charity begins at home, and FFRGOC shows its generosity on these two charity programs we've attend to every year for more than a decade now. The Share A Meal program allows FFRGOC to participate in St Joseph's Fish & Loaves Soup Kitchen feeding program on a Saturday, in the Spring and Fall – to serve almost 800 needy of Santa Ana, with traditional Filipino fares of pancit, adobo and lumpia. Fish & Loaves also provide bags of dry goods and other goodies for each family who line up early in the morning to get a ticket for lunch.





Christmas with OCH Children - Christmas with OCH Children ushers in the Christmas season very early in December with lunch, a Christmas program and gift-giving for the wards of Orange County at the Orangewood Children's Home. Thanks to the FFRGOC choir, and hosts of volunteers from chapters and areas, Christmas with OCH Children is always a happy event where FFRGOC shares the blessings of the year with the children of Orange County.



Summer Picnic – A time to get-together, away from the daily rigors of the week, to reenergize ourselves, albeit informally, over home cooked meals and games and a picnic Mass with Fr. Juan Caboboy.
